Inspiring Grace, named by one of the greatest living scholars of our time, Sayiduna Habib Kadhim as-Saqqaf, is a community organisation whose aim is to revive neglected Sunnahs of the Prophet (peace and blessings be upon him) who has himself informed us "The one who brings one of my Sunnahs back to life, it's as if he brought me back to life". Our focus will thus be on positive community action and will include the following:

- Feeding the local homeless and needy
- Setting up Prophetic sports for all ages and genders
- Dawah and outreach work through innovative workshops making use of documentaries and other modern media to positively interact with the wider community
- Working in schools/colleges to help young Muslims better understand their faith and appreciate the role Islam can play in their lives

INSPIRING GRACE is working in partnership with Dar al-Marifa, (Burnley) Illuminated Gardens (Blackburn) The Unity Foundation (Preston) and Greensville Trust (Liverpool).



Current projects include:-

- Local Archery classes for youngsters and adults
- Working alongside local mosques to deliver food parcels to families in need
- Providing basic staple foods (e.g. rice, vegetables, chicken) on a regular basis to a local homeless charity in Accrington
- Working alongside the Faith Centre in Burnley to deliver workshops and short lectures about Islam and the lives of Muslims in Lancashire
- Screening a series of documentaries on contemporary issues relevant to the local community relating to diet, interracial harmony, mental health and spirituality.
- Playing an active role in supporting local families who are experiencing problems and distress in their daily lives.
- Inviting local and international scholars to talk specifically about topical issues concerning the community. In May, Shaykh Jamal-ud-Deen Hysaw (Atlanta, USA) was invited to talk about the role of the mosque and the wider role it can play in serving our community. Shaykh Jamal also encouraged individuals to become more active in changing our society.
